



## Transit is Essential for People with Disabilities

Everyone deserves a right to reliable, frequent transportation. While many people have the option of driving a car, not everyone can. One in four Michiganders have a disability, and they face greater barriers to transportation than other populations. Transit services that are accessible, affordable, and reliable allow people with disabilities to travel independently with dignity, something everyone deserves.

### What To Know:

 34.5% of people with disabilities are employed, compared to 76.9% of general Americans. This employment disparity has been primarily attributed to a lack of transportation.<sup>1</sup>



- In 2019, over 650,000 Michiganders with disabilities lived in poverty or were unable to afford essentials. One of the largest barriers identified by Michiganders with disabilities was a lack of access to transit.<sup>2</sup>
- Nationwide, about 560,000 people with disabilities indicate they never leave home because of transportation difficulties. Out of all Americans that never leave their home, over half are people

with disabilities, making up 1.9 Million People.<sup>3</sup>

- People who'd prefer not to drive


### Transit Benefits People Who Don't Ride:
